Please Remember:

- You **must** bring child's up-to-date shot record • There is a \$10 charge for each children's vaccine.
- Medicaid and Medicaid Managed Care is accepted • There is no charge if unable to pay.
- Children must be accompanied by a parent/legal guardian or another adult with written permission from the parent.
- The Health Department participates in the federally-funded "Vaccines For Children" program.
- Neighborhood Clinics are funded by local tax levy dollars and grants from the Ohio Department of Health.
- Adult vaccine available (costs will vary by vaccine): Hepatitis A & B, Tetanus, MMR, and Pneumonia.

2009 Recommendations for Adults*

| Vaccine | Who | When/Dosage |
|---|---|---|
| Influenza (<i>flu shot</i>) | All persons wanting to reduce the likelihood of becoming ill with influenza or of spreading it to others | Once a year in the fall |
| PPV (<i>Pneumococcal polysaccharide</i>) | Persons age 65 years or older Persons with chronic risk factors (<i>2 vaccine doses per lifetime</i>) | 1-time dose Booster 5 years after 1st dose |
| Hep B (<i>Hepatitis B</i>) | All adults wishing to obtain immunity against hepatitis B virus infection; Persons with chronic risk factors | 3 doses are needed |
| Hep A (<i>Hepatitis A</i>) | All adults wishing to obtain immunity against hepatitis A virus infection; Persons traveling to some foreign countries; Persons with chronic risk factors | 2 doses spaced 6 months apart |
| Td, Tdap (<i>Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis</i>) | Adults who are previously unvaccinated will need three doses. Booster Tdap for adults recommended once. | 3 doses of Td if previously unvaccinated; Booster in 10 years |
| Meningococcal (<i>Menactra</i>) | College freshmen living in dorms; Persons with chronic risk factors | 1 dose |
| MMR (<i>Measles, Mumps, Rubella</i>) | Persons born in 1957 or later who are previously unvaccinated; Persons with chronic risk factors | 1 or 2 doses are needed |
| HPV (<i>Human papillomavirus</i>) | All previously unvaccinated women through age 26 years | 3 doses are needed |

*Not all vaccines provided at neighborhood clinics.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are vaccinations?: Vaccinations protect you against serious diseases. Most vaccinations are given as a shot. The words "vaccination" and "immunization" mean the same thing.

Are vaccinations safe?: Yes. Most vaccinations cause only minor side effects such as soreness where the shot was given or a slight fever. Serious reactions are very rare. The risks of the disease are far greater than a vaccination risk.
